As you can see from the photos attached, the work was duly done and the difference it has made has been very significant. The site looks so much better and natural, the children can really get up close to the water as well as have great fun trying to create a bridge across to the island through easier access to the water!

The children have delighted in finding and learning about frogs, toads, water boatmen, dragon flies, water snails and pond dipping nets is a popular activity in our wild school sessions. The work here also inspired one of our ex-pupils and now a carpenter to carve a beautiful new gate alongside the new fence. It looks such a magical entrance. I hope you agree from the photos!
