## > **116 volunteers at 17 sessions**

Our amazing volunteers have been helping maintain both woodland sites: fixing damaged tree guards, coppicing and creating a dead hedge at Hazeland this winter.

## > **7 community days**

So far this year we have held three family activity days, a forest bathing day, a pollinator day, a bat walk and a site tour for the public!



## > **Beavers move in!**

Just this week we sighted the first ever signs of beaver activity at one of our sites - for their protection, we can't disclose exactly where. Beavers are incredibly important ecosystem engineers - their work benefits a whole range of nature and wildlife.

## > **Community support**

We ran two woodland days with Family Action Group, a day service for adults with learning disabilities, autism and mental health issues. Our coordinator Tara also visited the local Alzheimer's Memory cafe to talk about trees.
